## Attachment A

Select 2 to 3 stems from the new growth on every stump and allow to regrow (remove all other stems on the stumps). These will grow quickly because of the large root system feeding the stems. In a year or two, the best stem can be selected as the new tree. If there is a tree such as birch, where you want a cluster, multiple stems can be left.

A circle has been placed around the stumps that are obvious in the photos. If there are other stumps, apply the same restoration conditions. The attempt is to restore the site close to the background in the first photo below. To achieve that, the hillside must be a no-mow, no-weed whip zone to allow the original vegetation to regrow. An 8' wide path can be left open and mowed for travel. Ideally, this path is not straight down the hill.
