## Dear Mary and Terry,

I can confirm that there was erosion on your shoreline. In 2018 I informally spoke with the consultant who was working with the Lone Lake Property Owners Association (LLPOA) about options that could be considered to stabilize and restore your shoreline. At the time, she and I were looking at properties that could be considered as part of Lone Lake's annual Lakeshore Restoration project. (In my role on the LLPOA board, I co-led that team.) We observed exposed, underlying landscaping material and how it was bulging from the gravel and rocks slumping underneath it. Also, we noted that rocks from an earlier rip-rap installation were largely gone, and the grasses and shrubbery were weakly holding back the shoreline. Although there were some good, deep-rooted willow trees and birch trees along the shore, erosion was undercutting the bank. (The lake association chose another property owner to work with whose shoreline restoration work could be accomplished within our project budget.)
